

Bunk Bed Assembly Instructions. Models 10033, 10034

Contents: sizes vary depending on model ordered

Tools required:

Slotted screwdriver, #2 Phillips or Robertson screwdriver

- A** = 2 lower bunk bed ends (44" tall)
- B** = 2 upper bunk bed ends (29" tall)
- C** = 2 bed rails per bed (75" long) The upper bunk front bed rail includes an attached guard rail.
- D** = 1 back guard rail
- E** = 4 slats per bed (twin = 40-1/4", full = 55-1/4" long)
- F** = 1 foundation set per bed (twin = 2 pcs, full = 3 pcs)
- G** = 8 connector bolts per bed (70mm long)
- H** = 8 cross dowels per bed
- I** = 8 wood screws, flat head per bed
- J** = 4 bunk bed pins
- K** = 1 Allen key
- L** = 1 Ladder
- M** = 2 wood screws, round head
- N** = 1 wood screw, 2 1/2" washer head



Please read all instructions before beginning

1. Assemble lower bed using 2 bed rails **C**, 2 lower bunk bed ends **A** and 8 connector bolts **G** with 8 cross dowels **H**. Refer to "Figure 1" for correct position of bed rail, bed end and hardware.
2. Loft version: 1 bed rail and 4 slats are omitted from the lower bed assembly
3. Assemble the upper bed using 2 bed rails **C** including the attached guard rail, 2 upper bunk bed ends **B** and 8 connector bolts **G** with 8 cross dowels **H**. Refer to "Figure 2" for correct position of bed rail, bed end and hardware. Insert the back guard rail **D** (see "Figure 4") before tightening connector bolts.
4. Insert 4 bunk bed pins **J** into the predrilled holes of lower bunk bed ends. Place the upper bed assembly onto the lower bed assembly ensuring bunk bed pins are inserted in the predrilled holes in the upper bunk bed ends.
5. For each bed assembly slide 4 slats **E** into bed rail grooves and secure each slat with 2 wood screws **I** using predrilled holes, refer to "Figure 3". Position 1 slat 1/2" from each bunk bed end and 2 evenly spaced in between.
6. Place a foundation set **F** onto each bed assembly. (Twin – 2 pieces 19" wide, full – 2 pieces 19" wide plus 1 piece at 15 1/2" wide.)
7. Hook the ladder **L** on the bed rail. Fasten the ladder to the bed rail using 2 wood screws **M**.
8. Model 10034, twin/full only: Fasten the ladder to the bed end using 1 wood screw **N**. Refer to "Figure 4".









Mattress sizes: Mattress on the upper bunk must not exceed 8 inches in thickness.
Recommended mattress thickness on lower bed is 8 inches in thickness.

Model 10034 – Twin over Full: Upper bunk - Twin size 37½"-38½" x 74-75". Lower bunk - Full (double) size 52½"-53½" x 74-75".

Model 10033 – Twin over Twin: Upper bunk - Twin size 37½"-38½" x 74-75". Lower bunk - Twin size 37½"-38½" x 74-75".

Safety Warnings

Follow the information on the warnings appearing on the upper bunk end structure and on the carton. Do not remove warning label from bed.

Always use the recommended size mattresses or mattress supports, or both, to help prevent the likelihood of entrapment or falls.

Surface of mattress must be at least 5 inches (127 mm) below the upper edge of guardrails.

Do not allow children under 6 years of age to use the upper bunk.

Periodically check and ensure that the guardrail, ladder, and other components are in their proper position, free from damage, and that all connectors are tight.

Do not allow horseplay on or under the bed and prohibit jumping on the bed.

Prohibit more than one person on upper bunk.

Always use the ladder for entering and leaving the upper bunk.

Do not use substitute parts. Contact the manufacturer or dealer for replacement parts.

Use of a night light may provide added safety precaution for a child using the upper bunk.

Always use guardrails on both long sides of the upper bunk. If the bunk bed will be placed next to the wall, the guardrail that runs the full length of the bed should be placed against the wall to prevent entrapment between the bed and wall.

The use of water or sleep flotation mattresses is prohibited.

STRANGULATION HAZARD: Never attach or hang items to any part of the bunk bed that are not designed for use with the bed; for example, but not limited to, hooks, belts and jump ropes.
